Federal Data Show Schools Have Become Safer In Recent Decades:

Education Week (3/29) reports according to a new report from the National Center for Education Statistics and the Bureau of Justice Statistics, states "US schools have significantly increased security measures and preparation for events like school shootings in the last 20 years. ... Meanwhile, rates of student victimization at school have continued to decline, fewer students have brought weapons to school, and fewer students report fear of harm in school." The piece adds that the data show that "contrary to popular perception, rates of violent deaths at school have not trended significantly upward in recent years."



FROM THE CLINIC: KICK BUTTS DAY

Since 1996, "Kick Butts Day" has been celebrated as a day of activism empowering our youth to STAND OUT, **SPEAK UP** and **SEIZE CONTROL** against Big Tobacco.

Did you know?

Tobacco use, in any form, is unsafe for our youth and is primarily started during adolescence.

Since 2011, cigarette smoking has declined while the use of hookah and e-cigarettes has increased

among middle and high school students.
In 2016, approximately 7 in 100 middle school and 20 in 100 high school students used some sort of to-bacco product, according to the CDC.
E-cigarettes, which typically contain nicotine, are now the most frequently used form of tobacco among

our youth.

Nicotine affects the development of the brain's reward system. Continued use of nicotine containing products can not only lead to nicotine addiction, but may increase the risk of addiction to other drugs.

There are currently more than 400 e-cigarette brands on the market.

According to the FDA, tobacco is the single largest preventable cause of disease and death in the United States. For Kick Butts Day, teachers, health advocates and youth leaders organize events to:

Raise awareness related to tobacco use in their communities.

Encourage youth to reject the deceptive marketing practices used by the tobacco industry.

Urge elected officials to promote public policies proven to reduce tobacco use and exposure to secondhand smoke.


