FROM THE CLINIC: May is Mental Health Awareness Month

Twenty-two per cent of American youth will have a diagnosable mental illness with "serious impairment" at some point before they are 18. What are childhood mental health disorders? Serious changes in the way children typically learn, behave, or handle their emotions, which cause distress and problems getting through the day. Monitor for the following changes in your child that may indicate a mental illness:

- Sadness or withdrawal that last at least two weeks or severe mood swings that cause problems in relationships at home or school.
- Sudden loss of appetite, frequent vomiting or use of laxatives might indicate an eating disorder.
- Physical symptoms such as headaches and stomachaches rather than sadness or anxiety.
- Difficulty concentrating and intense feelings such as overwhelming fear for no reason, sometimes with a racing heart or fast breathing.
- Self-harm/cutting or burning oneself. Children also may develop suicidal thoughts or attempt suicide.
- Use of drugs or alcohol to try to cope with their feelings
- Has trouble sleeping, including frequent nightmares

Parents, you know your child the best so if you have concerns about the way your child behaves at home, in school, or with friends seek medical advice immediately. Talk to your child's healthcare professional, school counselor or visit National Institute of Mental Health's Help for Mental Illnesses webpage. The month of April has been busy for both the students and staff at Berea-Midpark High School. As you may know, April is traditionally one of the Ohio State testing months. The students at the high school are taking End of Course exams which are required for graduation. Their focus and determination is to be commended.

But, did you know that April is also Autism Awareness Month? The students in PRIDE and National Honor Society have been working with the Special Needs and Art departments planning and promoting activities to increase autism awareness. If you look around the high school, you will see colorful posters and signs with interesting facts about autism and positive statements and quotes from our amazing students. The entire staff was provided with ribbons, made by the students, to wear during the month of April. As you drive by, be sure to notice the yard signs created by the Student Sign Shop class as well. The PRIDE group has also encouraged and modeled active involvement with students on the autism spectrum. During lunch periods, they have been asking students to write positive statements on paper puzzle pieces which are on display in the cafeteria. Some of them have participated in a lunch buddy program and are having lunch with the students with special needs. The building showed unanimous support by wearing blue on Friday, April 27th making it a 'blue out' to show support of autism awareness.

Be sure to mark your calendars for Saturday, May 5th and join the students of National Honor Society as they host the second annual Autism Dodge Ball Tournament Fundraiser here at Berea-Midpark High School. Funds will be donated to the Special Needs Department to help furnish the sensory room with much needed items for the students.
